

## SUGGESTED CURRICULUM FOR A B.A. DEGREE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

The Criminal Justice major is an interdisciplinary program stressing knowledge of theory and practice. It emphasizes a comprehensive understanding of both criminal behavior and the criminal justice system as basic preparation for careers in such fields as corrections, human services, research and planning, and law enforcement. An internship in a criminal justice agency is an integral part of the major, enabling students to complement their academic programs with practical experience. Majors in criminal justice are assigned an advisor who assists in selecting courses that correspond to their academic interests and career objectives. The program of study outlined below is only a model to be used as a guide. Thus, it is very important that students plan their specific schedule in close consultation with their advisor.
