

What are Some Possible Sanctions?

If you attend C.O.R.E., complete all assigned sanctions, and have no further documentations, your Housing Status may be kept at a Level One Status.

Although sanctioning may be one result of your hearing, The goal of the hearing is that you will learn from your behavior and not violate our University Codes of



Conduct again. Our expectation is that you learn what a great community member you can be and proud

to be a member of the University of Hartford community.

Possible sanctions that you may be assigned to complete by a certain deadline include, but are not limited to the following:

- Alcohol.edu for Sanctions
- Community Service
- Marijuana 101
- University Service Hours
- Fine/Damage Billing
- Written Warning

What is C.O.R.E. All About?

C.O.R.E. is a group Student Conduct Hearing. C.O.R.E. Stands for Community Opportunity for Resident Education.

The Steps of the Student Conduct Process

1. A student is involved in a documented misconduct violation on campus.
2. The student will be sent an email regarding their Student Conduct Hearing. The email may include an option to attend C.O.R.E. or will have the date, time, and location of your individual Student Conduct Hearing.
3. If you are invited to attend C.O.R.E., you will R.S.V.P. if you will be attending.
4. If you are not invited to C.O.R.E., you will attend your individual Student Conduct Hearing that is already scheduled.



Attendance at C.O.R.E. is Not Mandatory

Who Can Come to C.O.R.E.?

Not everyone who is documented for an incident will be invited to attend C.O.R.E. Your Student Conduct history is taken into consideration. You will receive an email inviting you if you are eligible. If you are not invited to attend C.O.R.E., you will be scheduled for an individual hearing.

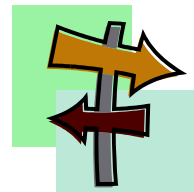
What Happens at C.O.R.E.?

What do you do?

1. Admit responsibility for your participation in the incident.
2. Relinquish the opportunity to request a review.
3. Complete the sanction that is assigned.
4. Attendance at C.O.R.E, completion of assigned sanctions, and no further behavioral problems will allow you to maintain a Housing Status Level One.

What does the Office of Student Conduct and Residential Life do?

1. They will explain the process to you and answer any questions you might have.
2. They will provide you with all reports of any documentation you are involved in.
3. They will have you sign any documentation necessary to resolve your case.
4. Educate you on the Strikes and Status Programs.



Why Should I Go?

- It is your personal choice to attend or not to attend, however there are many benefits to attending C.O.R.E. These benefits include:
- Keeping your Housing Status at Level One .
- A rapid resolution of your Student Conduct Hearing.
- An emphasis on becoming a great community member through a focus on Community Standards.



What Happens If I Do Not Go?

If you choose not to attend C.O.R.E. or cannot attend, you will attend your individual Student Conduct Hearing. This meeting was scheduled for you and all information was provided in the original email.

All information regarding your misconduct violation will be available to you at the individual hearing.
