



Possible Sanctions

What is a Sanction?

A sanction is an assignment given to you to as a result of a misconduct violation.

The following is a list of *possible* sanction outcomes. It is not meant to be exhaustive, as sanctions given will vary on a case by case basis:

Written Warning: A notice that if you violate any part of the student code of conduct a second time, the sanctions levied against you will be harsher.

Probation: A period in which you may be required to meet regularly with a professional staff member. This individual will help monitor your progress during the probationary term and may give you other sanctions to complete in that time period. Probation typically occurs after a warning, but can also be assigned for situations of a severe nature.

University Service Hours: A minimum of 5 hours served on campus with a professional staff member, who will determine the nature of your service hours. Examples of university service hours may include attending hall council meetings, participating in programs run by hall staff, cleaning the exterior/interior of your residential area, assisting the Residential Life furniture crew, etc.

Community Service Hours: A minimum of 10 hours served off campus. Your community service hours are coordinated with the campus Community Service Center.



Possible Sanctions

Alcohol EDU: An online alcohol education program that is broken up into two parts. Both parts must be completed in order to receive credit for the sanction. This version of Alcohol EDU is different from the one that incoming students are required to take and costs \$25, payable in cash at the Connections Health Education Center in Commons 116.

Marijuana 101: An online marijuana education program that costs \$50, payable in cash at the Connections Health Education Center in Commons 116.

Written Assignment: A written assignment could be an article, research paper, reflection paper, apology letter. Your resolution officer will work with you to explain the details of the assignment.

CHOICES: A class about alcohol intervention and harm prevention. This program requires one time attendance and costs \$25-\$50.

BASICS: BASICS stands for “Brief Alcohol Screening Intervention for College Students.” It is a one on one meeting with Patricia McKenna-Grant, Director of the Connections Health Education Center/Women & Gender Resource Center that involves individually focused motivational interviewing. The cost of this program is \$50.
